In the evening, after attending the

During the visit, India and the US finalised defence deal worth \$3 billion under which 30 military helicopters will be produced from two American defence manufacturers. A mega trade deal, pegged above \$10 billion, is expected next month when Robert

Lighthizer, US trade representative will visit New Delhi and meet Commerce & Industry minister Piyush Goyal in the second week of February to finalise the terms of the deal. As Trump left for the US, Prime minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday night thanked Trump for his visit to India and said the visit has been historical.

After Trump's tweet, Modi said India US friendship benefits the people of both the nation and the world.

Hicky The First Newsman

James Augustus Hicky is known as the 'Papa of Indian Newspaper'. Surprisingly he was not a journalist. A doctor by profession. Interesting part is, India's first printed newspaper 'The Bengal Gazette' was published by an Irishman named James Augustus Hicky in 1780.

On 27th February 2020, the dept. of Journalism, Mass Communication and Media Science of Brainware University had organized a seminar on J. A. Hicky. The seminar was narrated by Mr. Biplob Kumar Chandra, who is the Asst. Librarian of the university. Who researched and

discovered Hicky's journey and contribution to Indian newspaper and printing.

Mr. Biplob's research says, that Hicky was from Ireland and his childhood was tough as, his father died early. He went to England for his studies and came to India as a

doctor but pursued his career as a businessman. Later he was unimpressed with the way the East India Company was treating Indian people so he published the 'Bengal Gazette' to speak against the British rule. He was imprisoned several times. He was treated pathetically and he didn't get work appreciation. His death was very tragic as well. Mr. Biplob visited Bangladesh to present his research work. After the completion of his whole research, it will be published.

It was really great to have an interactive session on Hicky and his work for Indian press.

Law Dept's Step to Society Welfare

Brainware University has always showed its versatility in lending hands to good initiatives for the society and the organization. The University inaugurated the free Legal Aid Clinic on January 10th 2020, to provide free legal services to the underprivileged of the community. The members who are entitled to avail this service include a woman or a child, a member of schedule caste & schedule tribe, an industrial labour, a victim of human trafficking or beggar as referred to under Act.23(1) of the Constitution of India. It may include a mentally challenged person, or physically disabled person, victim of mass disaster, ethnic violence, caste atrocity. Members can include victims of flood, drought, earthquake or industrial disaster. Aid can be extended to a person, who is in custody in a protective home, or in a juvenile home, or in a psychiatric hospital, or a nursing home. A male having annual income of less than Rs. 1 lac, if the case is before any court other than the Supreme court, and having annual income

of less than Rs. 5 lacs, if the case is before the Supreme court can also be a beneficiary. With the support of District Legal Services Authority, 24 pgs. district Barasat or The State Legal Services Authority, City Civil court, Kolkata and its members, other Paralegal Volunteers as well as the students from the school of Law, Brainware University. The active members working on the prospect to expand this foundation are Mr. Amrita Dasgupta, Asst. Prof. and Ms. Moumita Mitra, Asst. Prof. School of Law, Brainware University. The objective of the legal aid clinic will provide support references and free counseling in matters related to domestic

kind of property litigations. Aim is to create awareness to its underprivileged neighborhood people who have no idea regarding taking any initiative to defend themselves.
